CLUB HISTORY

The Hernando Sportsman's Club, Inc. was founded in January 1980 as the Hernando County Rifle & Pistol Club, Inc. It was formed to fill a need for an organized shooting fraternity in Hernando County and the surrounding areas. The main purpose of the Club is to support and encourage the legitimate and safe usage of firearms, educate the public in safe firearms handling and encourage good sportsmanship and patriotism.

The Club began with eleven people who met at the North Campus of PHCC in January 1980. Among the Club=s first accomplishments was obtaining a place to shoot. The Club used the McDonald Mine east of Brooksville as a range for several years. In 1983, the Club obtained permission to use another old mine off Weatherly Road just northeast of Brooksville which was about four times larger than the original mine. In 1988, with 140 members and many gun shows and fundraisers behind them, the Club finally purchased the current 80+ acre parcel of land off U.S. Hwy 19.

Actual access to the property at that time was through the north side of the 80 acres. Initial zoning and permitting was finally accomplished after approximately 3 years and construction began. Through this initial period, the Club did not actually have a range to use but through many fundraisers and events, the Club managed to grow and retain it's members.

Work began on the 200-meter range and the trap range. Legal access to the club was obtained through a lease with the State for the use of the current road into Chassahowitz-ka Wildlife Management area. In February 1992, the Club finally hosted it's first open house on the Trap Range which was somewhat completed. Construction continued on the 200-meter range and began on the 100-yard Open Range to provide a general-purpose range. Further construction brought the club a Skeet/Five Stand Range, an Archery Range and a 50 Yard Range. Construction continues today as funds permit which are primarily derived from the club gun & knife shows. Phase 1 of the clubhouse is complete and the club is moving toward Phase 2 which will house the kitchen, dining area, offices and a small store as well as a small conference room area.

The club offers shotgun, rifle, pistol and archery daily. Various events held at the range include Hi Power Rifle, Junior 22 Rifle, Big Bore Pistol Silhouette, Cowboy Action Matches & Cowboy Fast Draw, Bowling Pin Matches, Precision Pistol, IDPA, USPSA, Action Rifle Matches, 3 Gun Matches, 2 Gun Action Matches, Steel Matches, Machine Gun Shoots and Cannon Shoots. The Club also sponsors a 4-H Shooting Program, Hunters Education, Appleseed Rifle and NRA firearms classes.

Having begun with eleven members in 1980, the Club today has over 1100 family memberships. The Club is also an affiliate of the National Rifle Association, Unified Sportsman of Florida, National Skeet Shooting Assoc. Florida Sport Shooting Assoc., CMP, USPSA, IDPA, SASS. Membership is open and available for a one-time \$300.00 initiation fee plus \$100.00 annual dues. It is a family membership that includes spouse and any children living at home up to the age of 21 years. A monthly newsletter is published and mailed to all members. The Club welcomes visitors to the range and to the quarterly club meetings held the first Tuesday in January, April & October in the Clubhouse with July being the annual club dinner meeting for members only.

Hernando Sportsman's Club is now an official affiliated Steel Challenge Club! Our club # is SCSA247. Our monthly matches consist of a minimum of 4 classifier stages. This allows a shooter to become classified by shooting just one of our regular monthly matches.

Steel Challenge consists of 8 nationally recognized stages. Each stage has a 5-target array of steel plates that are engaged by each shooter for five consecutive timed runs. The best 4 out of 5 Times runs of each stage are totaled for the shooter's score. The lowest overall time in each class wins.

Competition schedule: Match day registration begins at 8::15 am. Safety Briefing at 9:00. Shooters must attend the Safety Briefing to be eligible to shoot. Entry fee is \$11 for club members and \$16 for nonmembers for one gun only. Pre-signup is highly recommended and can be done www.matchsignup.org.

Classes include Centerfire handguns, Rimfire handguns & Rifles and PPC (pistol caliber carbines).

Modern Airgunning

After 60+ years, I still remember my first experience with my BB gun. My father would ball up some newspaper in a shoe box, and then tape the Sunday morning comics to the outside, and I would shoot away. Maybe ten feet, but I was still shooting. And when I ran out of BBs, I would empty the shoe box out, and shoot some more. Later in life, when I was around 12, I got my first powder burner, a .410 single shot crack-barrel shotgun. I would travel the woods with my trusty firearm. And throughout my life, I would get bigger and better. But there always remained the attraction to firearms, whether I was hunting, plinking, or just punching paper.

As I matured, meaning I got much older, I still had the attraction of shooting. But things happened; I'd established a life in a suburban environment. Aches and pains made it less likely I would adventure into the woods for countless hours with my trusty firearm. And then supply and demand really kicked in, ammunition and reloading supplies had virtually dried-up. And when you found some, it would cost a fortune to buy. And shooting in the backyard was impossible and truly expensive.

By accident, I started reading about and watching video of people shooting air guns. The term backyard friendly was used to describe the noise level of air guns. Some were powered by CO2, and other by pumping air into a tank which would propel the projectile. And these guns had some accuracy, enough to take out the unlucky bird or squirrel. But there range was very limited. After more searching on the internet, I found the world of the PCP (pre-charged pneumatic) air gun. These air guns are highly accurate and shoot extremely well at distances. I found there was competition matches; like RMAC, Pyramid Cup, Extreme Field Target, and more, and results were amazing. And the prizes were astounding.

So I acquired my first Puparium. One of the attraction was almost everything is adjustable. Pressures, ammunition, trigger, and I mean almost everything. I like to tinker and did a lot of reloading for my firearms. I wanted to most extreme accuracy I could get. Nirgunas're the same. When you find the right "tune' the results will go head to head with some firearms. In fact, many times you'll air guns competing side by side in smaller caliber rifles. And airgunshooters like to stretch the limits. First, the "experts" would say pellets were designed to be shot around850-880 FPS. Some "tinkers" decided totes these limits, and found there was even greater accuracy at velocities over1000 FPS. And since the shooter is allowed to use a moderator without jumping through ATF regulations, the argus-eyed backyard friendly.

Here in Florida, regulations are fairly lax, you have to be at least 16 to be unsupervised. and discharge theurge in a safe manner. In fact, it's legal to hunt deer with a .30 caliber airgun. There are other restrictions but this is the skinny version. Each shooter or hunter is responsible to know all laws. And in the more conventional calibers; .177, .22, .25, .30, there is little to no recoil. So all family members can enjoy shooting them without experiencing recoil, or the day after effects of recoil. And without recoil, there no flinching, so shooters learn better trigger control.

Florida offers an almost perfect environment year round for airgun competition. And more and more events are happening. If you would like to hear more about airgun shooting, give me a call 352-503-9225. I'm retired and really enjoy this shooting sport. Or drop me an email at jbc34446@gmail.com. 


